Frank Fulco was born on August 26, 1908 in Paincourtville, LA and has been a resident of Shreveport since 1909. His mother and father were Rosario Fulco and Concetta Russo Fulco of Cefalu, Italy. He was the second youngest of 13 children. He was educated in the public schools in Shreveport, graduating from C.E. Byrd High School in 1928. He also attended Tulane University where he was a member of the boxing team. Frank Fulco was married in 1934 to Josie Tritico of Lake Charles, LA, his wife of 65 years. He is survived by his wife Josie, two sons, Michael Fulco, his wife Tribby, of Monroe, LA and Frank Fulco, Jr. of Shreveport, six grandchildren, Sherry Fulco Brady, her husband Jerry of Houston, Sandra Fulco Wood, her husband Jeff of Austin, Frank Fulco, III, his wife Peggy of Houston, Michael Fulco, Preston Fulco, and Walker Fulco of Monroe, seven great-grandchildren and one brother, Charles Fulco.

From his youth, Frank Fulco was a progressive member of many fraternal and civic organizations, in particular the Progressive Men's Club. He traveled Louisiana establishing local clubs to promote good citizenship of young men of Italian decent. It was on a trip to Lake Charles where he met his future wife, Josie Tritico. In recognition of his efforts he was awarded a Certificate of Appreciation from the government of Italy in a presentation made to him at the House of Representatives Chamber in the State Capital in Baton Rouge. As co-founder of Standard Printing Co. in 1929, Frank was an active member of Shreveport's business community. He was the publisher of community and statewide newspapers. A selfless representative of his community, Frank was the youngest member at the time of his election to the Caddo Parish Police Jury in 1936. Frank was an honorable member of the Louisiana State House of Representatives, serving Caddo Parish and Louisiana under three Governors, Earl Long, Jimmy Davis and John McKeithen from 1956 to 1972. He was a special friend to fire fighters, educators and policemen. During his tenure, Frank authored or co-authored bills which were instrumental in establishing LSU-Shreveport, Southern University of Shreveport, and LSU Medical Center. In 1973 he was elected to serve as a delegate to the Louisiana Constitutional Convention. For his accomplishments he has had many honors bestowed upon him from organizations such as the Caddo Parish Commission and LSU-Shreveport.

Former legislator Frank Fulco Sr. dies

Frank Fulco Sr., a Shreveport businessman who also served four terms in the state Legislature, died at a local hospital Friday, a week before his 91st birthday.

Fulco had been in poor health in recent years and was undergoing kidney dialysis Friday afternoon when he went into cardiac arrest, said his son Frank Fulco Jr. of Shreveport.

"He had diabetes, suffered several heart attacks. And two weeks ago, we put him in the hospital," Fulco Jr. said. "His kidneys were failing."

The elder Fulco began his political career in 1936, when he became the youngest member of the Caddo

Parish Police Jury.

"As a parish commissioner, he supported the creation of LSU in Shreveport," said former LSUS Chancellor Vincent Marsala, who will serve as a pallbearer at Fulco's funeral. "He introduced a resolution for its creation and supported it until it was passed in 1966."

Fulco also was instrumental in the creation of the Southern University campus in Shreveport and LSU Health Sciences Center, Marsala said.

"He was an outstanding community servant who loved Shreveport and the people of Shreveport."

Fulco served as state representative for District 6 from 1956 to 1972. The four terms were served under three Louisiana governors. For several years, he was a member of the Democratic State Executive Committee.

"He had been in politics nearly all his life," Fulco Jr. said. "He did it to help

people. He was one of the honest ones, and we're thankful for that."

Born Aug. 26, 1908, in Paincourtville, Fulco moved to Shreveport with his Italian immigrant parents when he was a year old. After graduating from C.E. Byrd High School in 1928, he attended Tulane University. In 1929, he co-founded Standard Printing Co. In later years, he and his wife, Josie Tritico Fulco, published the Broadmoor News and other publications throughout the state.

Fulco's civic activities included serving as regional vice president of the Louisiana Jaycees, president of the Downtown Optimist Club, president of Shreveport's Progressive Men's Club and as a member of the Shreveport Chamber of Commerce, Elks Club and Southern Trace Country Club.

In 1956, Fulco was honored by the Italian government with the Star of Solidarity for working with and encouraging youths of Italian descent. In

Warrants out for sons of former officer

LITTLE ROCK, Ark. — Louisiana juvenile warrants are out for two boys whose father, a former police officer, was fatally shot while fleeing authorities, an Arkansas State Police spokesman said Saturday.

James B. Frye, 36, a former Orange, Texas, policeman was shot dead Friday after taking two women hostage at a business in Bryant. Frye was wanted at the time on warrants out of Texas and Louisiana.

old was held Saturday in a juvenile detention center in Arkansas. "He will face some sort of a hearing on Monday to arrange for his transfer to Louisiana sheriff's deputies," Sadler said.

Sadler would not say why the two boys were being treated differently, nor say what they are wanted for in Louisiana.

He said police wanted to learn about any unreported crimes, and to see whether they were connected with crimes being investigated in Arkansas, Louisiana and Texas, he said.

State police are investigating Frye's shooting at Middleton Heat and Air in Bryant, and a final report should be ready by Thursday, possi-

told The Benton Courier that two officers from his department were involved in the shooting. The two, whose names were not released, were placed on administrative leave with pay, pending the outcome of the investigation.

No one else was seriously hurt, although the ricocheting bullet hit the shop's general manager, Gary Waddle. He was treated at St. Vincent Infirmary Medical Center and released.

The incident began when a federal marshal, staking out a mini-storage shed where he believed Frye might show up, called for more officers when Frye arrived about 11:20 a.m. with the two boys.
